Background: Work with the Thurston County Food Bank (TCFB) and their produce recovery program to further integrate gleaning into the local community. This is the third and final year Harvest Against Hunger will place an AmeriCorps*VISTA member at the TCFB and thus a critical time. The main goal for the year is to transition the project model away from coordination by a Harvest VISTA and to partner organizations and TCFB staff to ensure future sustainability with local food banks, growers and volunteers to fight food insecurity.

As a project of Rotary First Harvest, the Harvest Against Hunger gleaning program creates a much needed way to enlist small to medium-sized farm operations in existing hunger relief efforts in local communities throughout Washington. For 28 years, RFH has focused on connecting and collaborating between different groups (farmers, truckers, food banks and others) to gather food that would otherwise go to waste.

CORE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Work in collaboration with host site supervisor at TCFB, Harvest Against Hunger program director, and local community groups to grow volunteer and grower base and expand program participation. Specific responsibilities might include:

Volunteer Recruitment:

- Research recruitment strategies and develop recruitment plan
- Meet with community leaders and organizations to raise awareness of program
- Represent produce recovery programs at community events

Grower Outreach:

- Contact local growers and agricultural organizations to explain program.
- Follow up with existing farm contacts to estimate potential donations and harvest timing.
- Explain liability issues and public safety and health requirements.

Program Coordination:

- Manage online database and registration system.
- Train and engage volunteers on ongoing basis.
- Coordinate logistics of gleaning project to accommodate growers and volunteers.
- Recognize donors and volunteers and strategize for participant retention.
- Document procedures, networking, volunteer hours and gleaning results.
- Work with and expand upon collaborative community/organizational relationships.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Knowledge and/or experience with the nonprofit community.
- Background working with civic and/or volunteer organizations.
- Highly organized and self-directed.
- Strong interpersonal skills and public speaking ability.
- Ability to work independently, but in collaboration with several other groups.
- Ability to juggle many different projects simultaneously, and prioritize as needed.
- Commitment to diversity, innovation and community-building.
- Ability to work weekends and occasional evenings (with time off in exchange).
- Ability to work in an office and outdoor agricultural environment and in hot or cold conditions.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- U.S. citizen, national, or lawful permanent resident.
- At least 18 years of age.
- Ability to commit to working 12 months beginning in November 2011.
- Computer competency, especially using Excel.
- College degree, or High School Diploma (or equivalent).
- **Requires the use of a personal vehicle with mileage reimbursement at standard rate.**

STIPEND & BENEFITS:

- A living allowance of \$10,296 distributed in equal installments twice monthly.
- Basic health insurance (VISTA member only, no dependents).
- Loan forbearance for federal student loans.
- A \$5,350 educational award upon completion of your service term (or \$1,200 cash stipend).
- Childcare assistance (available for those who qualify).
- The opportunity to work for an innovative, vital and demanding organization.
- Experience in project management, marketing, and leadership.
- Exposure to dozens of nonprofits and community partners.
